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Executive Summary

During May-July 2013, the University of New Hampshire Survey Center conducted a survey for New Hampshire's nine Regional Planning Commissions, as part of the *Granite State Future* and *New Hampshire Broadband Mapping and Planning* initiatives. Funded in part by a grant from the US Department of Housing and Urban Development, *A Granite State Future* is intended to engage New Hampshire citizens in a public dialogue, at the local, regional and state levels, about what they want for the future of their communities and state. Results from the survey will inform updates to the Regional Master Plans in each of NH's nine planning regions. These regional plans, whose development has been required under State law (RSA 36:47) for over 40 years, are advisory documents designed to provide municipalities with data and strategies to support local decision-making as well as enhance regional cooperation.

With support from the National Telecommunications Information Administration of the US Department of Commerce and in conjunction with the University of New Hampshire and other partners, the New Hampshire Broadband Mapping and Planning Program (NHBMPP) is a comprehensive, multi-year effort that seeks to understand where broadband is currently available in NH, how it can be made more widely available in the future, and how to encourage increased levels of broadband adoption and usage. Results from the survey will inform the broadband plans developed in each of NH's nine planning regions.

The specific areas of interest are New Hampshire resident's opinions on a range of issues facing communities around the State – transportation and broadband infrastructure, housing, economic development, natural resource management, energy and natural hazard mitigation. A survey of two thousand nine hundred and thirty-five (2,935) New Hampshire adults was conducted by telephone between May 9 and July 21, 2013. The response rate was 33% and the margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 2.2%. (See Technical Report for a more detailed description of survey methods.) The following figures display survey results, detailed tabular results can be found in Appendix A, Appendix B contains the open-ended responses and Appendix C contains the survey instrument.

The intent of this report is to provide NH's regional planning commissions and other interested parties with a broad overview of the data collected. This report should serve as a concrete focus for engaging with these data and using them to design and implement strategies for regional planning. However, every summary statement made in this report will generate numerous questions from the reader about how this data element or piece of information applies to other specific strata of the population or planning domain. Many of these questions can readily be answered by the extensive cross tabulations that are provided for each survey question in Appendix A of this report. Some of the questions that will be generated by this report will require more extensive and sophisticated analyses of these data. Knowing this, it is our hope that New Hampshire Planning leaders will share these data with other academics and community organizations that will actively use these data to help New Hampshire discover more about their local population and about how better to target planning initiatives to meet the needs of those in specific communities.

Each section begins with a summary narrative that is written in the form of short, bulleted sentences that describe selected indicators on the data tables and charts. These narratives are not intended to explain or summarize every indicator in the accompanying data tables. This section was not meant to provide the reader with any conclusions. It was intended to spark interest in the data and invite you to ask questions of this information and use the data cross tabs accompanying this report to understand better the planning concepts you are concerned about.

The charts and tables that follow display major findings of the survey. They are not intended to exhaustively present all the data in the survey. If no demographic differences were listed then responses were consistent across demographic categories. Not all findings are noted in this report; these are the highlights of the results. Additional results can be found in the detailed tables located in Appendix A.

Key Findings

- Although responses from North Country residents were largely similar to those of statewide residents, this
 region was the most unique in its answers. Significant differences from the statewide numbers included the
 type of neighborhood they live in (more residents live in a rural location away from development and less
 live in developments away from the town center), transportation investments (less likely to think policy
 makers should invest in reducing congestion levels on major roads based on what they see in their
 communities), community promotion (more likely to favor tourism), environmental protection (more likely
 to favor protecting forests for timber production), use of municipal funds (more likely to report willingness
 to pay higher taxes for broadband development), and internet usage (less likely to have an adequate
 connection to use VPN or watch online video).
- Residents believe that environmental protection and natural resource protection should be the top priority for investing public dollars, and a majority believes that all environmental protection measures mentioned should be high priorities for policymakers.
- Residents view energy efficiency and energy choices as the second most important priority for investing public dollars. Residents are largely in favor of all the proposed energy efficiency and renewable energy projects, except for the idea of having public charging stations made for electric vehicles.
- The development of single family housing and assisted living facilities were particularly favorable to residents while development of attached homes and townhouses were the least favorable.
- Residents say that the top activity that their community should actively encourage is promoting local agriculture (90%). Majorities want to encourage many other activities as well, including promoting safe places to walk or bike (84%), expanding or promoting current businesses (82%) and protecting historic buildings & neighborhoods (82%).
- Residents view quality schools as the most important thing to have in their community (93%). Other important aspects of a community include having nearby job opportunities (89%), farms, farm stands and forestry businesses (87%), small businesses and retail stores (83%), and grocery stores (82%).
- Residents view maintaining our bridges and highways to be the most important priority for transportation funding (74%). Residents were split on funding for other transportation initiatives, with a narrow majority favoring funding for senior and special needs transportation (56%).
- The large majority of residents (84%) have internet access at home, and almost all of them (90%) consider their internet access adequate for their uses. Most of them (76%) would not be willing to pay any additional money in exchange for faster internet speeds.

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Housing

Almost half of North Country residents (46%) describe where they live as a rural location away from the town center, followed by those in a neighborhood close to town center (34%), those in a development away from the town center (11%) and those downtown or in a town center (8%). There were also 1% who said they live in another type of location and 1% who were unsure.

- Residents of the North Country are *more likely* to live in <u>a rural location away from the town center</u> than statewide residents. They are also *less likely* to live in <u>a development away from the town center</u>.
- Those who have completed postgraduate work, and those who work at home or in another state are *more likely* to live in a <u>rural location away from the town center</u>.




Figure 1: How would you classify the neighborhood where you live? (q1)

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When asked whether they would prefer to live in a small house but have a short commute to work or a large home with a longer commute, half of North Country residents (50%) said they would prefer the large home and long commute, 47% would prefer the small home and short commute and 3% did not know (Figure 2).




Figure 3: Mixed Neighborhood with Stores or Residential Only Neighborhood? (q7b)

Meanwhile, 58% would prefer to live in a strictly residential neighborhood while 39% would prefer a mixed residential/commercial neighborhood and 3% did not know (Figure 3).

- Households with two or more children, households earning more than \$160,000, those aged 30 to 39 and those who work in another state are *more likely* to want a <u>larger home with a longer commute</u>.
- Older people (60 and older), retired people, and households earning less than \$40,000 are *more likely* to choose a <u>smaller home with a shorter commute</u>.
- Younger people (18 to 29), households earning less than \$20,000 and those with a high school education or less are *more likely* to want to live in a <u>mixed residential/commercial neighborhood</u>.

Nearly three in four North Country residents (73%) who answered that they would like to live in a neighborhood with a mix of residences and businesses would prefer a smaller house with a short commute. Nearly as many (68%) of those who chose a residential neighborhood where you drive to services also prefer a larger house with a longer commute.

Transportation

Three quarters (74%) of North Country residents think that policy makers should invest more money in maintaining roads, highways and bridges (with 56% willing to pay more in taxes to do so), followed by improving the availability of senior and special needs transportation (56%), improving the availability of bike paths (48%), improving the availability of public transportation (42%), expanding bus or rail service between major cities (41%), traffic safety (38%), sidewalks and crosswalk areas (34%) and reducing congestion on major roads (19%).

- Residents of the North Country are *less likely* than statewide residents to want investment in <u>reducing</u> congestion levels. Although residents of Carroll County are *more likely* to favor such an investment.
- Residents of Carroll County and households earning over \$160,000 are *more likely* to want investment in <u>the</u> <u>availability in bike paths</u>.
- Households earning less than \$20,000 and those who are not employed and not looking are *more likely* to want investment in <u>improving the availability to public transportation</u>.




Figure 4: Should Policy Makers Invest More Money in Transportation (q2)



Community Development

Two-thirds (66%) of North Country residents favor using municipal funds to provide water lines to existing and potential development (although just 49% would be willing to pay more in taxes for it), followed by sewer lines (59%) and broadband access (48%).

• Residents of the North Country are more likely than statewide residents to favor higher taxes for broadband.

Figure 5: Favor or Oppose Using Municipal Funds to Provide Utilities for Development (q11)



Four in five (80%) North Country residents think that their town should encourage single family detached housing, followed by assisted living facilities (77%), housing for adults over 55 (74%), clusters of single family homes (60%), accessory apartments (58%), housing in areas with business/residential mix (51%), manufactured housing (49%), apartment buildings (44%), townhouses (42%) and attached homes (42%).

- North Country residents are more likely than statewide residents to encourage manufactured housing.
- Residents of Coos County are less likely to encourage single family detached housing and townhouses.
- Young people (18 to 29) are *more likely* to encourage <u>apartment buildings</u> and <u>townhouses</u>.

Nearly all (93%) North Country residents find it important (82% "very important" and 11% "somewhat important") that there are quality schools in their community, followed by having nearby job opportunities (89%), farms, farm stands and forestry businesses (87%), small businesses and retail stores (83%), grocery stores (82%), medical offices (82%), cultural recreation facilities (77%), restaurants (71%) and that many places they want to go are within walking distance (42%).

- Residents of the North Country are *more likely* than statewide residents to think it is very important to have <u>medical offices</u>.
- Those aged 30 to 39, and households earning between \$20,000 and \$59,999 are *more likely* to think that <u>restaurants</u> are very important.




Figure 7: How Important Is It To Have In Your Community? (q3)

Only 17% of North Country respondents find housing to be very affordable in their town, 57% find it somewhat affordable, 15% find it not very affordable, 4% find it not affordable at all and 7% don't know. When it comes to renting, only 13% find it very affordable, 44% find it somewhat affordable, 18% find it not very affordable, 7% find it not affordable at all and 19% don't know.

- Coos County residents and NH residents of 5 years or less are *more likely* to think <u>purchasing property is</u> <u>very affordable</u>.
- Young people (18 to 29) and Grafton County residents are more likely to think rent is somewhat affordable.





Figure 8: How Affordable is Housing in Your Town? (q4 & q5)

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Figure 8b: How Affordable is Housing in Your Town? (q4 & q5)





Environmental Protection

Nearly all North Country residents (94%) view protecting water quality for drinking as a high priority for their community, followed by protecting air quality (83%), protecting water quality for recreational purposes like swimming and fishing (82%), protecting aquatic and marine habitats (78%), preserving farms and agricultural land (76%), protecting access to recreation land and scenic views (70%), protecting forests for timber production (69%), and managing shore land and waterfront development (59%).

- Residents of the North Country are *more likely* than statewide residents to think <u>protecting forests for</u> <u>timber production</u> is a high priority. Young people (18 to 29) and NH residents of 5 years or less are *less likely* to think this is a high priority.
- Young people (18 to 29) are more likely to think protecting water for recreational use is a high priority.
- Those aged 50 to 59 and households earning between \$40,000 and \$59,999 are *more likely* to think protecting access to recreational land and scenic views is a high priority.
- Those aged 50 to 69 and Carroll County residents are *more likely* to think <u>managing shore land and</u> <u>waterfront development</u> is a high priority.




Figure 10: Priority Placed on These Community Issues (q9)

A large majority of North Country residents (90%) say that promoting local agriculture should be actively encouraged in the community, followed by promoting safe places to walk or bike (84%), expanding or promoting current businesses (82%), protecting historic buildings & neighborhoods (82%), attracting more non-polluting light industry (78%), promoting other recreational activities (78%), promoting tourism (78%), attracting increasing access to forests and trails (70%), sponsoring special cultural or sporting events (70%), increasing access to ponds, lakes and rivers (66%), expanding recreational fields (62%), and attracting more stores and shops (54%).

- Residents of the North Country are *more likely* than statewide residents to say their community should actively encourage <u>promoting tourism</u>.
- Young people (18 to 29), households earning between \$90,001 and \$160,000, and NH residents of 6 to 20 years are *more likely* to say their community should actively encourage <u>sponsoring special cultural or</u> <u>sporting events</u>.
- Coos County residents and households earning less than \$40,000 or between \$90,001 and \$160,000 are *more likely* to say their community should <u>attract more stores</u>.
- Young people (18 to 29), households earning between \$20,000 and \$39,999 and those with a high school education or less are *more likely* to say their community should <u>expand recreational fields</u>.




Figure 11: What should be actively encouraged in your community? Check all that apply (q12)

Energy Policies

Nearly three in four North Country residents (73%) support promoting renewable energy sources such as solar, wind and geothermal (with 56% who "strongly support"), followed by expanding incentives for home energy efficiency improvements (73%) and higher energy efficiency standards in new buildings (72%). Meanwhile only 28% were in support of public charging stations for electric vehicles.

- Those aged 60 to 69, college graduates, and households earning more than \$160,000 are *more likely* to strongly support <u>higher energy efficiency standards in new buildings</u>.
- Those who are self-employed, unemployed and work at home are *more likely* to strongly support <u>expanding</u> <u>incentives for home energy efficiency improvements</u>.
- Young people (18 to 29) are *less likely* to strongly support either the <u>higher energy efficiency standards</u> or <u>incentives for home energy efficiency improvements</u>.




Figure 12: Support/Oppose Energy Policy Changes (q13)

More than half of North Country residents (54%) think that local governments should be very involved in guidelines for renewable energy (such as large wind farms), 34% think they should be somewhat involved, 4% think they should be not very involved, 7% think they should be not at all involved and 1% don't know.

• Those aged 60 to 69, those who have completed postgraduate work and households earning more than \$160,000 are *more likely* to want local government to be very involved in energy guidelines.




Figure 13: How Involved Should Local Governments Be In Guidelines For Renewable Energy? (q16)

Emergency Preparedness

Seven in ten (70%) North Country residents are concerned (33% "very concerned" and 37% "somewhat concerned") with snow or ice storms in their community followed by power outages (59%), wind damage (55%), flooding (50%), wildfires (44%) and drought (26%).

- Residents of the North Country are *less likely* than statewide residents to be very concerned about <u>power</u> <u>outages</u>. They are *more likely* to be concerned about <u>wildfires</u> than statewide residents.
- Young people (18 to 29) are more likely to be very concerned about snow or ice storms.




Figure 14: How Concerned Are You About Weather Related Events In Your Community? (q14)

Only 12% of North Country residents are very concerned about their community's level of preparedness in weatherrelated situations, 29% are somewhat concerned, 36% are not very concerned, 22% are not at all concerned and 1% don't know.

• NH residents of 5 years or less and households earning less than \$20,000 are *more likely* to be very concerned about their community's level of preparedness for severe weather.




Figure 15: Concerned about Your Community's Level of Preparedness? (q15)

Priorities for Investing Public Dollars

North Country residents' top priority for investing public dollars is environmental protection (24%), followed by energy efficiency (19%), economic development (19%), safe and affordable housing (13%), transportation system (8%), infrastructure for development (7%), preparedness for weather-related or other emergencies (4%), all priorities are equal (4%), and something else (2%).

When the top two responses are combined, environmental protection (43%) and energy efficiency (37%) are the two most cited priorities.




Figure 16: Priorities for Investing Public Dollars (q17)

Broadband

A large majority (84%) of North Country residents have internet access in their home, while 16% do not (Figure 11). For those who do not have internet access at home, a plurality (20%) says that they don't have it because they don't need it, followed by it is too expensive (19%), they don't know how to use it (13%), they have access at another place like their job (12%), they don't have an adequate computer (10%) and it is not available where they live (10%). There were also 16% who cited another reason and 1% who didn't know (Figure 12).

• Those aged 60 to 69, those with a high school education or less and households earning less than \$20,000 are *less likely* to have internet access at home.




Figure 17: Do You Have Internet Access At Home?




Figure 18: Most important reason why you don't have internet access at home?

North Country Statewide

A slight majority of North Country residents (54%) have a cable internet connection, followed by those with DSL (22%), fixed wireless (7%), satellite (5%), cellular (3%), and dialup (3%). There was also less than 1% who said they had fiber, 2% with another type of connection and 3% who didn't know.

- Residents of the North Country are less likely than statewide residents to have cable internet.
- Coos County residents, young people (18 to 29), and households earning less than \$20,000 are *less likely* to have <u>cable internet</u>.




Figure 19: What type of internet connection do you have at home?

For those North Country residents who do have a dialup or satellite connection, most (60%) say it is the only option available, followed by it is too costly to change (9%), and the learning curve is too steep (1%). There were also 10% who said that they had another reason and 19% who didn't know.

- North Country residents are *more likely* to say they have dialup or satellite because <u>it is the only option</u> <u>available</u>.
- There were 2% of statewide residents that said it was <u>too much effort to change</u> or they <u>don't know other</u> <u>options</u>. There were no North Country residents to choose either response.





Figure 20: If you are on dialup or satellite, why?

For those North Country residents who don't have satellite or dialup, a plurality (42%) of residents say that they have their current internet provider because it is the only option available, followed by being happy with their current provider (21%), it being too costly to change (5%), it being too much effort to change (2%), they don't know what other options are available (2%) and the learning curve is too steep (1%). There were also 20% who had another reason and 7% who didn't know.





Only 6% of North Country residents say that their monthly internet bill is less than \$20, while 36% pay \$20-49 per month, 26% pay \$50-99 per month, 16% pay \$100 or more per month and 16% didn't know.

- North Country residents are more likely than statewide residents to pay \$20-49 per month.
- Older people (70 and older) are more likely to pay \$100 or more per month.




Figure 22: What is your monthly internet bill?

Seven in ten (70%) North Country residents currently pay for a bundled internet service, 27% do not and 3% did not know.

• Households earning less than \$20,000 or more than \$160,000 are *less likely* to pay for bundled service.




Figure 23: Do you pay for a bundled service?

A large majority (82%) of North Country residents use their home internet to check email and their connection is adequate to do so, 68% shop online with an adequate connection, 40% watch online videos and have an adequate connection and 17% use VPN and have an adequate connection to do so.

- North Country residents are *less likely* than statewide residents to have an adequate connection to <u>watch</u> <u>on-line video</u> or <u>use a VPN at home</u>.
- Young people (18 to 29), older people (70 or older), those with a high school education or less, and retired people are *less likely* to <u>shop online</u>.
- Older people (60 or older), retired people and households earning under \$20,000 are *less likely* to watch online video. Younger people (18 to 39) are *more likely* to <u>watch on-line video</u>.
- Households earning more than \$160,000 and those who have completed postgraduate work are *more* likely to <u>use a VPN at home</u>. Households earning less than \$20,000 and those with a high school education or less are *less likely* to use a VPN.




Figure 24: What Do You Use the Internet At Home For and is it Adequate for that Purpose

Nearly all (90%) North Country residents state that their internet connection is adequate for their uses, followed by 9% who say their connection is not adequate and 1% who don't know **(Figure 19).** Three in four (76%) North Country residents would not be willing to pay more for faster internet speeds; 16% would be willing to pay 25% more per month, 3% would be willing to pay 50% more per month and 5% don't know **(Figure 20).**





Figure 25: Do you consider your internet connection adequate for your uses?

Technical Report

How the Sample Was Selected

The New Hampshire Regional Planning Commissions A Granite State Future (GSF) Survey was a telephone survey of randomly selected adults in the state of New Hampshire. This survey was conducted using a procedure called Random Digit Dialing (RDD), of both landline and cellular telephone.

A sample of households in the area was selected by a procedure known as <u>random digit dialing</u>. The way this works is as follows. First, with the aid of a computer, one of the three digit telephone exchanges that are currently used in the state (e.g., 772) is randomly selected. The computer then randomly selects one of the "working blocks"--- the first two of the last four numbers in a telephone number (e.g., 64)--and attaches it to the randomly selected exchange. Finally, the computer program then generates a two digit random number between 00 and 99 (e.g., 57) which is attached to the previously selected prefix (772), and the previously selected working block (64) resulting in a complete telephone number, i.e., 772 6457. This procedure is then repeated numerous times by the computer to generate more random numbers, so that we have a sufficient quantity to conduct the survey. The end result is that each household in the area in which there is a telephone has an equally likely chance of being selected into the sample. This procedures is done for both land line and cellular exchanges.

The random sample used in the GSF survey was purchased from Scientific Telephone Samples (STS), Foothill Ranch, CA. STS screens each selected telephone number to eliminate non-working numbers, disconnected numbers, and business numbers to improve the efficiency of the sample, reducing the amount of time interviewers spend calling non-usable numbers.

Each of these randomly generated telephone numbers is called by one of our interviewers from a centrally supervised facility at the UNH Survey Center. If the number called is found not to be a residential one, it is discarded and another random number is called. (Approximately forty-five percent of the numbers were discarded because they are found to be businesses, institutions, or not assigned.) If it is a residential number, the interviewer then randomly selects a member of the household by asking to speak with the adult currently living in the household who has had the most recent birthday. This selection process ensures that every adult (18 years of age or older) in the household has an equally likely chance of being included in the survey. No substitutions are allowed. If, for example, the randomly selected adult is not at home when the household is first contacted, the interviewer cannot substitute by selecting someone else who just happens to be there at the time. Instead, he or she must make an appointment to call back when the randomly selected adult is at home. In this way, respondent selection bias is minimized.

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When the Interviewing Was Done

New Hampshire adults in the GSF survey were interviewed between May 9 and July 6, 2013. Each selected respondent was called by a professional UNH Survey Center interviewer from a centrally supervised facility at the UNH Survey Center. Telephone calls during the field period were made between 9:00 AM and 9:00 PM.

Response Rates

Interviews were completed with 2,935 randomly selected adults in New Hampshire from a sample of 25,114 randomly selected telephone numbers. Using American Association for Public Opinion (AAPOR) Response Rate 4, the response rate for the Granite State Future survey was 33% percent. The formula to calculate standard AAPOR response rate is:

$$\frac{I}{(I+P) + (R+NC+O) + e(UH+UO)}$$

I=Complete Interviews, P=Partial Interviews, R=Refusal and break off, NC=Non-Contact, O=Other, e=estimated portion of cases of unknown eligibility that are eligible, UH=Unknown household, UO=Unknown other.

Weighting of Data

The North Country oversample includes approximately 200 interviews in each of the three county based sub-regions within the North Country Council Region. The data have been weighted to account for known biases of telephone surveys. The data in the North Country oversample of the Granite State Future survey are weighted by the number of adults and telephone lines (landlines and cell phones) within households to equalize the chances that any one adult would be selected for inclusion. The data are also weighted to match population parameters of respondent sex, age of respondent, and county-based sub-region (see Appendix B (p. B-13) for regional numbers pre- and post-weight).

Sampling Error

The Granite State Future survey, like all surveys, is subject to sampling error due to the fact that all residents in the area were not interviewed. For those questions asked of five hundred (500) or so respondents, the error is +/-4.4%. For those questions where fewer than 500 persons responded, the sampling error can be calculated as follows:

Sampling Error =
$$\pm 1.96 \sqrt{\frac{P(1-P)}{N}}$$

Where P is the percentage of responses in the answer category being evaluated and N is the total number of persons answering the particular question.

For example, suppose you had the following distribution of answers to the question, "Should the state spend more money on road repair even if that means higher taxes?" Assume 1,000 respondents answered the question as follows:

YES	47%
NO	48%
DON'T KNOW	5%

The sampling error for the "YES" percentage of 47% would be

$$\pm 1.96 \sqrt{\frac{47(53)}{1000}} = \pm 3.1\%$$

for the "NO" percentage of 48% it would be

$$\pm 1.96 \sqrt{\frac{48(52)}{1000}} = \pm 3.1\%$$

and for the "DON'T KNOW" percentage of 5% it would be

$$\pm 1.96 \sqrt{\frac{5(95)}{1000}} = \pm 1.4\%$$

In this case we would expect the true population figures to be within the following ranges:

YES	43.9% - 50.1% (i.e., 47% ±3.1%)
NO	44.9% - 51.1% (i.e., 48% ±3.1%)
DON'T KNOW	3.6% - 6.4% (i.e., 5% ±1.4%)
